- Avoid the temptation to search right away: Stop and read!
- Read documentation materials
- Break assignments into manageable sections for students—dealing with data can be overwhelming (and novel!) for students
- Good ways for students to find data:
 - *Read empirical research studies (that use the data!)
 - *Consult a topical compendia
 - *Ask an expert (reference librarians)
 - *Visit a course-specific research guide at the library (Reference librarians LINK http://apps.carleton.edu/campus/library/help/help/liaisons/ will gladly create a course-specific data page for you.)
 - *Read Kristin's blog (LINK blogs.carleton.edu/wesearch)
 - *Look at data archives (e.g. ICPSR) (LINK http://www.icpsr.umich.edu/)
