PLEASE: Turn off cell phones before class starts. Do not answer cell phones or text message while attending class. If these devices are used during an exam, you will be assigned a grade of zero and the issue will be turned over to the Academic Dean for follow-up.

ATTENDANCE POLICY: It is difficult to pass this class if you have not attended to class. Some material presented in class is not in your textbooks, thus, attendance is strongly urged. If you miss a class, you are advised to acquire the notes from one of your peers. Tardiness to this class is also frowned upon as it disrupts the learning of your peers -- be respectful and on time.

LABORATORY: You must attend lab. If you fail the lab, it is extremely difficult to pass the class because the *lab grade is* 25% of the final grade you will receive in this class (see above). If you have a lab scheduled over a university holiday, you must attend another lab in the same week to make-up the lab.

TESTING: Do not be late to tests. If you arrive to a test after someone has already finished, you will not be allowed in the room to take the test and you will not be allowed to make up the test. Make-up tests will be given only on presentation of an approved medical excuse (in writing from your doctor including his/her office number so that departmental personnel can check validity), or by pre-excused permission of the instructor. No exceptions! All doctor's excuses will be checked. If an excuse is found to be falsified, it will immediately be handed over to the Academic Dean for follow-up. Contact me immediately if you miss an exam. With an approved excuse, you only have until the next class to make up the exam or until the exams are returned in class. The format for the make-up test will be either an essay or oral test. Tests will cover mostly the material discussed in class and material in your textbook. There are three regularly scheduled tests and one final exam. I will drop the lowest test score. Note: you will be allowed to make up only one exam per semester (except in the case of a medical emergency). Cell phones must be turned off before the exam. If you are caught text messaging, your phone and exam will be confiscated immediately and give to the Academic Dean for further review. Please note time and date of final exam (see above). According to University regulations, no exam will be given at an earlier date.

QUIZZES: Each week you are assigned chapters to read. In the syllabus, dates are marked where you must complete 11 online quizzes via *e*Learning. You must finish these quizzes before class starts on the day the quiz is due. If you do not complete these quizzes you will be penalized in your class participation. You may continue to take the online quiz until you have answered all the questions correctly or class starts. The highest score will be used as your grade. You may use your textbook to complete the quizzes. After class has begun on the specified day, no more quizzes will be accepted. This is a firm deadline. If you know you are going somewhere, you must complete the quiz before you leave.

eLEARNING: This class *requires* the use of *e*Learning for a variety of functions. Daily powerpoints will be posted on this website. You will use *e*Learning to complete the online quizzes (see syllabus and calendar in eLearning for dates the quizzes are due) and we will communicate via the use of the mail and announcement functions. *e*Learning can be accessed at <u>elearning.ua.edu</u> or through your mybama account. The same username and password that you use for mybama is also used for *e*Learning.

CPS: This class *requires* a CPS remote (\$21 new/\$16 used) which is available for purchase from the campus store which can be sold back to the store at the end of the semester. You have one week from today to purchase them--no exceptions. You must bring this remote to class everyday. It is used to respond to questions in class and helps me to know who comes to class and participates. It is a violation of the academic honor code to bring someone else's CPS remote to class. I can easily figure out if this happens by calling class attendance. If I find that this has occurred or I see a student with two clickers the responsible parties will be immediately referred to the Academic Dean for follow-up. Students also need to register for the class via the einstruction web site (http://www.einstruction.com). When you go to register you will have to pay an enrollment fee (\$15). The bookstore does sell enrollment codes for \$20 but it is cheaper to go to the website and pay it via your credit/debit card. The class key is F36180J649. Go to Login and click Student. Instructions for enrollment are on our class webpage in *e*Learning listed on the homepage as student enrollment instructions.

PARTICIPATION GRADE: Attendance is not taken in this class but your participation will be evaluated based on your frequency and correctness of your CPS responses, your in-class discussion, and completing the quizzes as required. In determining the final in-class participation grade, the lowest three CPS class scores will be ignored. Not only do you have to bring your CPS remote to every class but you must answer the CPS questions. Simply turning on your CPS will earn you a grade of zero for participation on that day. You must answer the questions and get at least 75% correct for that day to obtain the full participation grade for that day.

LAPTOP POLICY: You may use your laptop to take notes in this class. Please turn the sound off so that other students are not bothered. There is not a wireless internet connection in this building. If I find that you are playing games or preparing for another class on your computer instead of taking notes, you will be banned from bringing your laptop to class.
