



Proposed Timeline




Steps of developing a National ACE strategy

Based on the analysis of the ACE Guidelines, the climate change related education, training, public awareness, public access to information, and public participation efforts in the United States have advance part of the ACE defined states.

Additionally, numerous initiatives and partnerships internationally have enhanced cooperation on these matters.

Using the ACE Guidelines, we can develop an initial strategy within a year.




Priority Audiences for Climate Change Education

The Climate Change Education community recognizes that achieving its vision requires engaging a diverse range of communities including all groups listed here.

To ensure the success of an ACE strategic plan, the following are Priority Focus Areas:

- Public Access to Information
- Public Participation
- Funding
- Communication
- Measurement and Evaluation



Format for listening sessions

How can we better engage a diversity of local leaders and partners **through youth focused programs**: what are their needs?


